Homophones

Homophones are words that sound the same, but they have different meanings and different spellings. Each homophone is used in a sentence that shows its meaning.

I	I like cake.
Eye	I got soap in my eye .

read	I read a book about dogs.
red	Mark's favorite color is red .

to	I went to school.
two	My little sister is two years old.

Synonyms

Synonyms are words that mean almost the same as another word.

Example 1: big ➔ large
Big and large both mean the same thing.

Example 2: tiny ➔ small
Both **tiny** and **small** mean the same thing.

Antonyms

Antonyms are words that mean the opposite of another word.

Example 1: hot → cold
Hot is the opposite of cold.

Example 2: big → small
Big is the opposite of small.

Compound Words

Compound Words are made when two words are put together to make one word.

Example: flashlight
The two words that make up the word **flashlight** are **flash** and **light**.

Consonant Blends

Consonant Blends are made when two or more consonants blend together. Consonant blends can be found at the beginning of a word or at the end of a word. The most common beginning blends are: **ch, sh, th, or wh**.
